## **STARTER**

What promises do we see that are being fulfilled in this moment? What promises are being spoken but ultimately fulfilled in Jesus?

What do these promises tell us about the heart of God?

## **DISCOVERING JESUS**

As we read these promises we can know that they are true in our minds, but not experience them in our lives. What do you believe the differences is between "knowing the promises" and "living in the promises" of Jesus?

John Piper wrote, "Saving faith — which also sanctifies — is not only a backward glance to the foundations of faith in the work of Jesus. Saving faith is also the forward glance in the confidence that future grace, which Christ purchased, will in fact come true — for the world, and for me. Saving faith in the promises of God includes spiritual enjoyment of the God of the promises." (John Piper, You Can Believe the Promises of God and Be Lost)

How do we practice having a forward glance of the future grace of Jesus?
