

In our time together in the book of Luke, we want to discover Jesus, the man who is God, in a fresh way. Each week we will be discovering a new aspect of who Jesus is and how we fulfilled God's redemptive plan for all creation.

## **STARTER**

How did you come to learn about the idea there is a God? (We are no so much asking when you came to believe in Jesus, but rather when you began to think that God could be real.)

In the part of the Gospel of Luke we studied this week, Jesus asks the disciples, "Who do you say I am?" This is a pivotal question for each of us today.

## **GETTING INTO THE SCRIPTURE**

Please take a few moments to read Luke 9:18-20.

In the relationship between Jesus and his disciples, what was the significance of the questions Jesus was asking?

In the next verses of Luke 9, there are multiple examples from multiple angles following up Peter's statement that Jesus is the "Christ of God." Break up your group into smaller groups and give them each a part of Scripture. Ask them to discover how that passage points them to Jesus as being the Son of God, the Christ, the Redeemer or what it means to follow him.

- 1. Luke 9:21-22, 43-45
- 2. Luke 9:23-27
- 3. Luke 9:28-36
- 4. Luke 9:37-43
- 5. Luke 9:46-48

As you look at all these different passages, take time to sum up what it means for Jesus to be the Son of God come to save us from our sin. What different characteristics or themes come out of the verses above?

## **MAKING IT REAL**

Jesus is the same today as he was then. What does it mean for Jesus to be the Son of God in your life now?

What other personal takeaways did you see from the sermon on Sunday? Where did you sense God speaking to you?

## **DISCOVERING JESUS**

In your own life, what would it look like for you to walk in greater faith in Jesus as the Christ? Where do you need to take up your cross and follow Him?
