What instincts do you think humans have in common with animals?

GETTING INTO THE SCRIPTURES

Read 2 Peter 2:10b-22

Brandon said, "The Gospel calls us to be aware of the enemy while living in The Way of Righteousness." What are the characteristics of the world and false teachers? How has false teaching impacted the Church today?

The way of false teaching involves sexual impurity, lack of true life, and acting like animals. How does the Old Testament story of Balaam tie into Peter's warning against false teachers? Why is the church so susceptible to falling for false teaching?

The Way of Righteousness involves being set free from sin, practicing righteousness, and reflecting Jesus. Read Romans 6:17-18. How can others' sins affect your own feeling of being in bondage? How does your sanctification process reflect Jesus to the world?

MAKING IT REAL

Are there aspects of your life that are still living bondage to sin? Maybe this bondage comes as a consequence of your own actions or someone else's.

Ask the Holy Spirit how you can be walking in Jesus's righteousness and be reflecting Jesus to our world.
